Summer Uniform

As we now move into the warmer months of the year, we wanted to share with you how we will operate during warm days to ensure students can stay as comfortable as possible.

Blazers – Blazers are a mandatory item that must be always worn. We understand rooms get warm, especially in the summer term, so staff will allow blazers to be taken off once students have entered the room and are sat at their desk. When we experience extremely hot days, we will communicate with you and your child to let them know that blazers will not be expected to be worn. We will be very clear on this, so if you do not hear anything, blazers must still be worn.

Jumpers – Jumpers do not need to be worn.

In addition, please be reminded of previously communicated uniform standards:

1. **Skirts:** Tight fitting or bodycon skirts are not allow. Skirts should be tailored. A good guideline is for skirts to fall no shorter than a few inches above the knee.

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2. **Tight trousers:** Please be reminded that school trousers should not be tight-fitting. This guideline is in place to ensure that students maintain a respectful and modest appearance, contributing to the overall professional atmosphere of our school. Only 'tailored' or 'slim' trousers will be allowed to be worn. Please see the pictures below for further guidance



- 3. **Prohibited Items:** in addition, students are not permitted to wear hoodies, gilets, sweatshirts, jewellery (inc. bracelets), nose studs or trainers within the school premises. These items have been identified as potential distractions and may impede the uniformity and professionalism we strive to instil in our students.
- 4. **General Guidance:** Please remind your child to bring a small bottle of water with them to school. In extreme heat, please encourage students to use the shaded areas.

We appreciate your support and cooperation in reinforcing these guidelines with your child. Consistency in dress code adherence contributes significantly to the overall positive atmosphere within the school.

Should you have any questions or concerns regarding the dress code policy, please do not hesitate to contact the school, asking for your child's form tutor in the first instance. We value open communication and are here to address any queries you may have. Thank you for your commitment to ensuring that our school maintains high standards of appearance and behaviour. Attendance

Useful Attendance Reminders:

- Students should attend school even if they have a cold or feel slightly unwell
- Holidays in term time cannot be approved
- Written proof of medical and dental appointments must be provided



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The link between attendance and attainment is clear:

- In 2018/19, just 40% of persistently absent (PA) children in KS2 achieved expected KS2 standards, compared with 84% of pupils who regularly attended school.
- 36% of PA children in KS4 got 9 to 4 in their English and Maths GCSEs, compared to 84% of regular attenders.¹
- And it's never too late to benefit from good attendance:
- More than half (54%) of pupils who were PA in Year 10 and then rarely absent in Year 11, passed at least 5 GCSEs, compared to 36% of pupils who were persistently absent in both years.²

But attendance is important for more than just attainment:

• Regular school attendance can facilitate **positive peer relationships**, which is a **protective factor** for mental health and wellbeing.³


